The summer reading program is open to all ages from children to adults and with the theme "Libraries ROCK." What better place to start than at the library? There are still lots of programs to attend and books to read before this program ends Aug. 19. Community Heroes Night at the library! On Tuesday Aug 14 the local fire, police, ambulance, etc. will be here at the library. Say thank you to some of the men and women who work to keep us safe and healthy and learn a bit more about their jobs. Guests include the Cetronia Ambulance Corps, Whitehall Police, Whitehall Fire, the Lehigh County Sheriff, and a Medevac helicopter. (Any guests may be called away in the event of an emergency.)

The **Friends of the Library** will sponsor a bus trip to the **Grounds for Sculpture** on Saturday Sept. 29, 2018. The Grounds for Sculpture in Hamilton, NJ, is home to over 300 sculptures on 42 acres. There is a lot of walking, but the surface is flat and the pace leisurely. The cost of \$75.00 per person includes bus, driver gratuity, admission, and guided tour. No outside food is allowed, but there are eating establishments on the grounds. The bus will leave from the library, 3700 Mechanics-ville Road, Whitehall, PA 18052, at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 29. The one hour guided tour starts at 11 a.m., and then you are on your own to have lunch, stroll the grounds, and browse the gift shop until we leave PROMPTLY at 3:30 for Whitehall. We travel RAIN OR SHINE, so be prepared. You may pick up a form and flyer at the library and mail it to ENZO Travel no later than Aug. 15, 2018.
